Enjoy the Church Bells over Christmas and the New Year

The church bells are normally rung for half an hour before the main weekly Sunday Service, but over Christmas you will hear them at different times! On the Sunday before Christmas they will ring for the 6.00pm service; on Christmas Eve they will be rung for the midnight service which starts at 11.30pm, and again on Christmas Day for the 10.30am service. The New Year is rung in, starting with the bells half muffled at 11.30pm and continuing unmuffled from midnight for 15 minutes after tolling the tenor bell (the heaviest at half a ton) for 12 blows. No drinking for the bell ringers on New Year's Eve then! If anyone wants to see what is going on, just turn up (before the ringing starts) and ask if you can watch. Better still, go to one of the practices which are every Wednesday at 7.30pm and learn for yourself how it's done!



Parish Council News

Barrowby PC held another open morning on Saturday November 17th. The idea of the open morning is to give an opportunity for residents of the village to share their views and concerns with the Parish Councillors, as well as being given information on the role of the council and some of the current issues in the village.

One area for discussion raised by many of the attendees was the proposal to install a knee-rail around the village green to potentially act as a deterrent to vehicular trespass. The majority of the attendees could see the reason for the proposal but were not sure that it was required – these views will be reflected when the Parish Council next meets to discuss the rail. Also on the discussion list was parking in the village with one or two interesting ideas put forward for the PC to consider. Overall the sentiment was that anti-social behaviour issues had diminished recently and that the efforts to keep the village tidy and the work and effort spent on the flower beds and grassed areas was much appreciated. The PC will hold another open morning in early 2013.

All ages turned out in force on a cold grey day to plant over one hundred trees in Barrowby as part of the Woodland Trust's Jubilee Woods project Donations in aid of the village newsletter were invited with participants receiving a documented and numbered tree for posterity. Trees were sponsored for loved ones, for brand new great-grandchildren and for entire families. The location of each tree will be mapped, placed on the Barrowby web site and a printed record will be held in the Parish Council archive.

Children from Barrowby School will be involved in planting the remainder of the trees - a range of birch, cherry, hazel and rowan - which will provide cover around the Low Field in the village.

An Appeal to Dog Walkers who use Low Field

Living in Barrowby has many benefits. We are very lucky to have a superb open space at Low Field, for football and cricket, for leisure walkers and, of course, for dog walkers. However, it is the behaviour of some irresponsible dog owners that is spoiling the Low Field for other users. The Barrowby Pavilion Committee on behalf of the Parish Council installed dog waste bins during the summer. The bins are very well used by dog walkers, however not by all.

Please remember that if a dog fouls in a public place, by law the owner or person in charge of the dog at the time must clean up after it and put the mess in a bag tied tightly and place it in a public refuse bin. It is the responsibility of the dog owner or the person in charge of the dog to clear up any dog mess left by their dog. Being unaware that the dog has fouled, or not having suitable means of removing the mess is not a reasonable excuse for failing to clean up after a dog.

Dog waste presents health risks to everyone but in particular children who are at risk of contracting toxicariasis which can cause blindness. The actions of a small number of irresponsible dog owners is putting everyone at risk. The Low Field is patrolled by SKDC Enforcement Officers and anyone allowing their dog to foul and not clean up may be liable to prosecution with a maximum fine of £1000.

It is in everyone's interest to keep the Low Field clean so please clean up after your dog.

We would also ask dog walkers if they could discourage their dogs from straying too near the new trees until they have been established, many thanks.
