In support of Barrowby News



'It was like going into another world' ...

Rebecca Simmons, a 14 years old boat girl, worked on the Grantham Canal in 1922. The canal offered a pleasing change to the region's industrialised canals. Rebecca's family carried roadstone from Mountsorrel in their horse drawn boat, attending schools in the vale with her brother Tom whenever they could. *Told by her son, Ray Fletcher*.

In 1922, the canal was in decline and within 7 years, trade had ceased. The canal was 'mothballed' until the 1960's, when some of the original bridges were flattened. However, much of the infrastructure remains, and is little altered from the original designs of eminent engineer, William Jessop.

In acknowledgment of William Jessop's mastery, The Grantham Canal Society, are opening the Carpenter's Shop at Woolsthorpe by Belvoir (behind the 'Dirty Duck'), 10.00 - 5 p.m., Thursday 6th September as part of Lincolnshire Heritage Open Days with an exhibition, guided walks and Narrowboat trips. To be sure of your place on the boat call 07971173069.

Entry to the event is free, but boat trips will be £3.00 per person.
