# Barrowby resident celebrates milestone

Pastures Road resident Roly Wright celebrated his 100th birthday on Friday 18<sup>th</sup> January. A party which followed at the Grantham College Refectory was attended by more than 150 relatives and friends from around the country and beyond. "In a hundred years you make many wonderful friends and it was lovely to see so many of them here", said Roly of the celebrations.

Born locally in Sproxton, Roly lived in Scunthorpe for a time before moving to the Isle of Man. During the 1970s and into 1980s he was a TT Race Chief Sector Marshall from *Creg-ny-baa* Corner to the finish and he continues to enjoy the race from his armchair. He and wife Christine came to live in Barrowby thirty years ago.

Roly's career as a watchmaker started with his training, in Grantham, at 8 year's old. He continued with his watch business after active army service in World War II and only stopped when he



decided, aged 98, that his dexterity was not quite as good as it once was!

Originally a lorry driver hauling corn for a local firm - located where Houghton's Jewellers now stands - he owned his own vehicle. However, the first lorry which Roly bought in 1934 had a very inauspicious maiden voyage, with Roly putting the lorry into a ditch near Buckminster and requiring help from two horses from a nearby field to pull him out!

A few years ago, Roly was pictured in the *Grantham Journal* having grown a 1lb 13oz tomato. The monster tomato is an uncommon

variety which he has bred over many years, which he says taste delicious despite their size and are perhaps the secret of his wife's pasta sauces! He, with his wife Christine, helped organise and worked with the Red Cross Open Gardens scheme for many years and only stopped recently.

Locally his family is busy in Grantham with son Roy heading the Carnival and grandson Simon a member of Gravity FM.

When asked to what he owed his long and healthy life he had no hesitation in saying "Let nothing in the world bother you and always get 8 hours of sleep".

# Solving the Mystery of the Barrowby Bassoon

Peter Brooks has given us some fascinating information from the church records regarding the church band and the bassoon recently featured in the Barrowby News.

It is thought that the bassoon was probably manufactured around 1805. Records show that it was repaired in 1811, at a cost of £1 -18s - 9d.

The manufacturer, William Milhouse, was born in Newark in 1761. Part of the famous Milhouse musical instrument making dynasty in the 18<sup>th</sup> and 19<sup>th</sup> centuries, the family moved to London to make their fortunes.

It must have worked, as William is described on a tradecard in 1797 as a "Manufacturer to their Royal Highnesses the Dukes of Kent & Cumberland".

There is another Milhouse connection to the church. There used to be a gallery at the back of the church (presumably for musicians), which records show was built by a Mr. Milhouse who lived in the area (there was a Milhouse family in Knipton).

It is thought the wind band at Barrowby church was followed by a brass band and then an organ – probably by 1851, as an entry in May that year stated that the church organist was paid £1 for 6 months salary.

Peter says of the bassoon: "It will no doubt forever remain a mystery as to where the instrument has been all these vears, but at least it is now in good hands".

New owner, Stephen Rex, is considering a full restoration of what he calls a "pretty and original" instrument.


