The Reading Room Clocks

It has been a constant source of frustration to many that we have three clock faces on the Reading Room all showing different times!

This spring, the Parish Council commissioned a full survey of the clock tower and the clocks and was relieved to find that the clocks and their motors are in good Family News and Ideas condition but the control mechanisms need to be reviewed.

Previously the only means of accessing the clocks was by crawling through the roof space or onto the roof itself. Plans are now in hand to provide each clock with a separate electricity supply and to install independent controls for each clock face.


The weather was a bit windy, making conditions a little awkward but with some persuading all went well in the end and a thoroughly great time was had by all of us.

Strike up the Band

By 'A Barrovian'

Live music is an occasional feature of village life today, with The White Swan sometimes hosting folk and jazz groups, a ceilidh to celebrate Burns Night becoming a tradition at the Memorial Hall and in the recent past, the Beer Festival provided an additional venue. Wind the clock back to before WW1 however and live performances in the village were much more common. Barrowby boasted not only its own brass band but a string band too.

Barrowby's brass band had a good local reputation and played not only in its home village but in villages as far flung as Colsterworth, Hough, Croxton and Ancaster, as well as in Grantham. It also competed successfully, thereby being able to bill itself as the 'Barrowby Prize Band'.

The earliest record of the band performing is on New Year's Day 1865. In 1885 it held its first annual celebratory dinner at the White Swan, perhaps because its then bandmaster, William Musson, was also the landlord. The Band was very active. In 1897 the Grantham Journal records that it had performed 21 engagements with an additional four sacred concerts. In that year it also led the celebration of Queen Victoria's Diamond Jubilee at Belton. By 1905 the band had acquired a uniform, appropriately of Lincoln Green. By early 1909 however the band seems to have got into trouble and became, for a while, defunct. This did not last long for it was advertising for engagements by March of the same year.

Within the village the Band played regularly in the grounds of The Rectory, The Grange, and The White House for a variety of village fetes and fund raisers. In 1913 it staged a Grand Promenade Concert at The Grange to raise funds for new instruments. It was 24-strong at this time, a large number for a moderate sized village.

The last identifiable reference to the Band is in September 1914 when it participated in a Great Patriotic Meeting in the village. Perhaps the Band, like so many other things, was swept away by the tide of war.
