This included 32 children as well as staff, parents and ex-pupils of the school. The children swam in teams, with each person swimming a length at a time as a continuous relay. Our teams managed to complete: 989 lengths which is 22.5 lengths per person or 15.5 miles in total. This sponsored event raised valuable funds to be distributed amongst local good causes throughout Grantham, by The Rotary Club of Grantham.

On Friday 8th February, we were very pleased to welcome the Sports for Schools team and Harry Owen, one of Great Britain's top male gymnasts to the school. Applying to register Stevens Gutter

Village greens are the essence of rural England: grass in the centre of a village complete with oak, a recreation ground, a maypole..... In fact a green is any land on which a significant number of inhabitants have indulged in lawful sports and pastimes, for 20 years, as of right.

Today, anyone can apply under section 15 of the Commons Act 2006 to register land as a green, so Barrowby Parish Council have applied to register Steven's Gutter with Lincolnshire County Council, to help protect it from development and preserve it for use by local people. We are not sure at this stage how long the process will take but we will update you when we know more.


