Annual Parish Meeting

All Parish and Town Councils are legally required to hold an Annual Parish meeting between 1st March and 30th June to discuss parish affairs and explain Parish Council activities over the last year. Barrowby's was held recently with main issues covered including: 2013/14 budget, review of current projects and an open session. Topics raised

included parking (relating mainly to the school), potholes and the British Legion building. Although not well attended, the Parish Council will continue to hold quarterly open sessions to give residents the chance to review council activities.

Walter Redmile Update:

Walter was born in Corby Glen, where his father was an ironstone worker, moving to Cabbage Court (now Welby Court) before 1891. One of 12 children, his father continued as an ironstone worker, walking 7 miles to work each day on the heath south of Harlaxton. His sister, Katie, married William Nichols and they had a son, Walter Nichols, whose daughter, Margaret Nichols was born in 1937. The late Margaret married Michael Dodds, who still lives in Grange Paddock. So Walter Redmile was Margaret's great uncle. Walter died in Worksop in 1957, aged 65 years.
