Building for the 22nd Century

Dry Stone Walling

An ancient craft, a dry stone wall's style depends on the local area's stone resources — Barrowby's is soft golden sandstone, regular in shape, which builds well into a wall.

Building a wall: A wall's strength derives from finding the right stone for the right place like a jigsaw, the more experienced the waller, the easier it becomes. Most walls are double thickness: using the middle core, or 'hearting', which ties the sides together, is as important as placement of the facing stones.

Bigger stones, faced into the wall to give it strength, are placed at the wall's ('cheek') end; the largest stones are usually used for the foundation layer, as they can bear heavy weights. If there are enough,

they are also used as 'throughstones', going right through the wall, again to give strength.

The style of a wall's top varies from place to place; the commonest is the 'Cock and Hen': large stones placed end-on in a line, although some prefer a limemortared top.

Building a dry stone wall as a retaining wall is particularly difficult as the waller has to work from one side only; single or double thickness they need to be angled towards the retained land and anchored with throughstones into the bank. It's surprising how much stone is needed:

for a double skin wall you need 1 tonne to build 1 square metre.

The challenges of walling...

Clive has been walling for several years now, building new walls and rebuilding weathered or damaged walls. He also builds mortared

He also builds mortared walls, using lime that breathes with the wall,

working hard to get the right ratio of mortar to stone to produce a strong and aesthetically pleasing wall.

Clive loves the challenge, gaining great satisfaction both from repairing and from building from scratch, creating a majestic wall that will stand for at least 100 years...

Clive also practises the ancient craft of hedge-laying.

Barrowby FC: Developments for Success

Barrowby FC, a well-respected club, has been in existence for a number of years. A Football Association Charter Standard club (an assessed and accredited scheme to check and recognise the manner in which the club is organised to meet the requirements of the FA), all our Managers and Coaches have undertaken the required FA training and all are DBS checked

The club's aim is to provide a safe and enjoyable environment to play and watch football. For the younger teams a key objective is to create an atmosphere in which all children can learn footballing skills and enjoy themselves in a fun/learning environment. We provide training to develop players' abilities and as a result our teams are quite successful in cup and league competitions.

For the 2013/14 season the club plans to have teams at U7, U8, U9, U10, U11, U12, U13, U14, U15, U16, Ladies, Veterans and a Senior Men's team, equating to 150 junior player and 80 adult player club members, coming from not only the village but as far as Bourne, Colsterworth and Bottesford.

Our teams will play in 7 East Midlands leagues against teams from Lincoln, Nottingham, Leicester, Daventry, Louth and other locations in between.

The name of Barrowby is well known by many other clubs and teams. We are very proud to have probably the best changing room facilities in the local area. impressing the majority of leagues in which we play and visiting clubs. The club is looking to develop and now needs to improve the pitch facilities to match the Pavilion.

We plan, therefore, to develop the top pitch, used by the older age group junior and the adult teams, to provide dugouts and an access path for team managers and coaches, and to erect fencing to separate the pitch from spectators.

These are prerequisites for certain leagues - without these our teams would not be able to develop. We also need to undertake some pitch improvement works to improve the playing surface itself and hope to be in a position to do this over the summer, subject to having sufficient funds. We believe that these improvements will enhance the current facilities and will reinforce why people enjoy playing for and coming to watch football at Barrowby FC.
