Grantham Bridge Club moves to Barrowby

As a result of increased membership, Grantham Bridge Club recently moved from Harlaxton where they had been for the past fourteen years, to Barrowby Pavilion.

The Club was started in the late sixties by the late Keith & Pauline Ibbotson, with the initial venue being The George Hotel. It is currently the only Bridge Club in Grantham affiliated to The English Bridge Union, and runs two teams of 8, who compete in the Leicestershire League.

In addition during March, April & May a member of the Committee has organised a "No Fears" morning session in The Reading Room, Barrowby, on Wednesday mornings for



people who have just taken up the game or not played for some time, and wish to improve. This has proved popular, and will restart again in September.

Superfast Broadband: where are we now?

Thanks to all of you who, since the June newsletter, have pressed for increases in broadband speed for those parts of the village still on slower speeds. We have some progress to report from County Councillor, Jo Churchill and local MP, Stephen Phillips.

BT have investigated a cheaper method of feeding the necessary cabinets and are now hopeful that Cabinet 37, serving Low Road, can be included in their commercial roll-out programme, rather than as part of the later BDUK funding route within the partnership contract with Lincolnshire County Council. Delivering fibre optic broadband is complex but BT hope that much of the commercial rollout can be completed by the end of 2013. However, Cabinet 26, serving Casthorpe Road, is proving more difficult. According to the latest information from BT Openreach, the ducts which feed this cabinet are blocked over quite a long distance and they have not yet been able to identify an alternative route for the cable. This could make enabling fibre optic broadband for this cabinet commercially unviable as large civil works seem to be required.

So, final timescales for those of us in Barrowby yet to receive higher broadband speeds are not confirmed. We will keep you updated in our next issues; in the meantime, please keep up the pressure by registering your interest via the Openreach website if you have not yet done so.

Walter Redmile: WW1 War Medal



Can you help?

Do you know any family of Acting Bombardier Walter Redmile of the Royal Field Artillery, born in 1891 in or near Barrowby? In the 1901 census he was living at 12, Cabbage Court, (located where Welby Court is now), with his father, Samuel Redmile, his mother, Lucy Redmile and 5 sisters and a brother.

He might have moved north to Mansfield and/or Worksop and may have died in Huddersfield in the late 1950s.

His First World War medal and bar, awarded to members of the Indian and British Expeditionary Force who served in France or Belgium between 5th August – 22nd November 1914, has come to

light in Halifax and we have been asked if there are any family members remaining in the Barrowby or Grantham area who would be able to receive the medal
