I have just finished doing an 'Introduction to Beekeeping' course with Grantham District Beekeepers. I have learned about bee inspections and that they have to have regular check-ups. My mum's friend is a beekeeper, and she lets me help with her inspections, where we look for diseases such as Varroa and European Foul Brood - getting kitted up in my bee suit (see photo) and being part of inspections is a wonderful experience.

At the beekeeping course I learned all about the history of bees and diseases that can infect a colony. Unfortunately I am the only junior member at the course - it would be good to see more children becoming involved with beekeeping.

I am currently preparing for the Lesley Thorne Award [Young Bee Keeper of the Year]. I am researching bees, how to keep bees and will put my practical skills to the test (hopefully I'll be the bees knees!)



Being part of the beekeeping world is a fantastic experience and you should bee-come part of it!

Allotment Tips for July

Harvest/continue to harvest - beetroot, blackcurrants, broad beans,

cabbages, carrots, cauliflowers, courgettes, cucumbers, dwarf French beans, gooseberries, lettuces, onions, peas, the rest of the new potatoes, raspberries, redcurrants, runner beans, spinach, spring onions, strawberries, sweetcorn, turnips and radishes.

Plant - cauliflowers.

<u>Sow</u> - beetroot, carrots, cabbages, lettuces, radishes, spring onions and turnips.
