A Barrowby Anthology for 2014 - Barrowby Scribblers Update

The Barrowby Scribblers, launched last September, was formed with a small bunch of individuals looking for others with a common interest in writing. The group has already covered a wide range of topics, including the various writing forms, short stories and novels.

November was National Novel Writing month (NaNoWriMo) which is a worldwide challenge. The goal is to write 50,000 words in 30 days. There was doubt in the group about tackling such a mammoth task, but also great enthusiasm and excitement about the challenge. By the end of the month each member had given their best. Even with busy lives each member - whether they completed or not - had gained something. They had planned and plotted a novel and completed a huge chunk of writing. Without starting the challenge or having the support of the group many of the group members would not have gained the head start on work that can be progressed during 2014.

We are setting goals to enter short story competitions this year, with the intention of producing an anthology of short story work for sale by the end of 2014. Goals are always more likely to be achieved within a group setting, so if you have always harboured a desire to become a writer join our supportive group and see how we can help you with your writing dreams.
