Defibrillator Update

Great news! The first defibrillator has been installed on the exterior of the Reading Room, the cabinet for the second defibrillator has been installed at the A1 end of High Road and the defibrillator will soon be fitted. A further two are planned for Westry Corner and the Hedgefield Road area.

They are a very visible yellow. The cabinets are public access, so if you call 999 for an ambulance and the patient needs to be defibrillated, the ambulance service will tell you where the nearest defibrillator is and give you the code to open the cabinet.

You do not need to be trained to use the defibrillator and it will not work unless the patient needs to be defibrillated. The defibrillator gives you very clear instructions on how to use it.

However to give us all confidence in using a defibrillator if we ever need to, we have arranged for two awareness sessions, which will be held in the Reading Room on:

Tuesday 14 October at 7.30pm. Saturday 18 October at 10.30am

The sessions last about 2 hours. Not long to be more confident to save a life! They are being led by the Community Heartbeat Trust (www.communityheartbeat.org.uk/), a national charity focussed on the provision of life saving defibrillation services in local communities.
