

entrants took part.



Debunking Gardening Myths

Any of us who pretend to be gardeners listen to Gardeners Question Time or watch Monty Don on Gardeners' World to pick up tips and handy hints. We also ask other people for their advice. But sometimes we can get caught out by advice that might not be as accurate as we thought.

Here are two gardening myths debunked by Barrowby Gardeners' Association member, Ian Walker.

Myth I: Watering is best done in the evening

Water does evaporate more slowly when it is done in the evening BUT because it stays longer it makes it easier for slugs to move around and for fungal diseases to develop. So is it better to water in the morning then? Morning watering dries out quickly on the surface but, if done properly, the soil remains moist underneath.

So what *is* true? What is necessary is thorough watering, preferably on soil with a reasonable amount of organic matter. And what is also true is that it is more or less useless to sprinkle small amounts of water on a regular basis, as this results in high loss from evaporation and is actually less healthy for plants.

Another myth is that watering in sunlight damages leaves. This has never been proven and, realistically, any rain shower on a sunny day would cause immense harm but doesn't.

Myth 2: Leaving legumes in the soil after harvesting adds nitrogen to the soil.

By the time of final harvest the plants are dying off. Hardly any nitrogen is left – about 3 percent according to Chris Beardshaw – and the plant is still trying to feed the foliage.

If you do intend to leave the foliage for a while cut stems at soil level and just leave the roots.
