This November there are commemorations across the country to mark the centenary of the outbreak of the First World War. In Barrowby there are a number of events taking place during November. Details are on page 2 but here is an article by Barrovian about some of the stories behind the fallen.

"Lest We Forget" - by Barrovian

This year particularly our thoughts turn to remembrance and it is the Great War that evokes the strongest feelings of loss and sacrifice, though it is beyond living memory.

To a visitor, Barrowby might seem to lack a clear War Memorial but there are in fact several reminders of the conflict and Barrowby had good reason to remember.

There is a Roll of Honour in All Saints Church that lists 30 men with a Barrowby connection who lost their lives in WW1. This is roughly 20% of the men from the Parish who would be eligible for service, and a casualty rate that is double the national average for the enlisted.

A similar Roll of Honour was displayed in the British Legion until destroyed in the recent fire. The land on which the Legion was built was donated by Colonel Swan of The Grange as a personal act of remembrance.

The Memorial Hall dates from after WW2 so is more a recognition of that conflict although the original hut – now much modified – is thought to have been one originally used by the Machine Gun Corps at its training ground in Belton Park.

The final physical reminder is perhaps that now most forgotten and that is All Saints Graveyard. Two of the Great War victims lie there buried in Commonwealth war graves: Albert Gascoigne who served with the Grenadier Guards, and J Southern who was in the Machine Gun Corps. Southern died on the 19th November after the Armistice from wounds received earlier.

All the fallen deserve to be remembered but some of their stories are especially poignant. Frederick Gascoigne, brother of Albert, died at Jutland when the battlecruiser he served on blew up. His name is also on his brother's tombstone.

Richard Hornsby, born at The Grange, was lost at Gallipoli. His body was never found. It is likely that his death was a result of a fire in undergrowth started by our own artillery.

Charles Ogden died following an encounter between a U-boat and the transport ship he was on. Whether he died as a result of gunfire or was drowned when one of the lifeboats foundered on launch is not now known. Surprisingly he is buried in an Algerian cemetery.

These sons of the village paid with their lives. We do not have a clear record of how many other village men served with the forces and survived although we do know that by as early as September 1914 just one month after war had been declared 25 were enlisted. It is quite possible that upwards of 100 men saw service during the course of the conflict.

We do however forget the role played by those who stayed behind. Barrowby was then largely a farming village and the role of that sector in helping feed civilians at home and an army overseas was critical. Men and women in the village would play their part.

The Armed Forces Memorial brought home to everyone just how much sacrifice was made and how young some of the young men (boys) were when they signed up.




