Barrowby's own poppy commemoration of the Great War

Did you get the chance to see Barrowby's own version of the Tower of London Poppy Memorial? As part of the village's commemoration of the centenary of the First World War, 80 poppies were planted outside the Reading Room and they stayed there from the Remembrance weekend to Armistice Day on the 11th November (pictured).

One large poppy with 30 petals was also made to commemorate each of the 30 men of Barrowby who lost their lives as a result of the Great War.

Each poppy was tagged with the name of a Barrowby man with the location of where he died. Each poppy was hand made in the village from felt and mounted on canes. Details of the men are available on the Parish Council web site and on the


