From Casthorpe to Cunard...

Quite a number of Barrowby residents made their way to Liverpool to celebrate Cunard's 175th anniversary. Muriel Arnold, who grew up at Casthorpe, was also there for a Reunion with 45 former Pursers. She joined the sea-going staff as Assistant Purser serving on board Queen Elizabeth, Queen Mary and Mauretania. With the arrival of Queen Elizabeth 2 she was appointed Social Secretary for the World Cruises.

The story of Cunard began with an advertisement in The Times by the British Admiralty inviting bids for a timetabled steamship service carrying mail across the Atlantic. Samuel Cunard, 52 years old and a cautious business man, was successful and the Britannia, 1,455 tons with paddlewheels, masts and sails, left Liverpool on 4th July 1840 with 63 passengers.

175 years later, with more than a million people lining the banks of the River Mersey, we watched the unprecedented spectacle of the Queen Mary 2, Queen Victoria and Queen Elizabeth sailing in formation and making a 180 degree turn in the river to salute Liverpool and 'take a bow' in front of the Cunard Building with the Red Arrows screaming approval overhead.
