Update from the Playground Meeting

On Monday 14th September the Reading Room was the venue for a successful public meeting concerning the establishment of the Barrowby Play Equipment Forum.

The forum arises from a Parish Council initiative to establish a group of Barrowby residents who will drive a community consultation exercise and make recommendations as to the type and style of play equipment which will be installed on the Village Green and the Adam Stiles play areas.

Concept drawings of possible play equipment and the Parish Council's "Terms of Reference" for the committee amply demonstrated the Parish Council's commitment to providing high quality and stimulating play equipment for the youngsters of Barrowby.

It is anticipated that the funding for this project will come from charitable trusts specialising in providing community projects and, if necessary, the capital raised from the partial sale of land on the south side of Adam Stiles.

The committee is due to meet within the next few weeks when the consultation exercise is due to take place. If you are approached for your point of view please do not hesitate to offer it as we are looking to include as many people as possible in our community consultation exercise.

Inspired to get baking from the GBBO?

From October, Coco's Kitchen will be running a series of workshops in Barrowby on basic and advanced cupcake making & decorating, useful techniques for decorating girls' and boys' birthday cakes, sugarpaste modelling and Christmas cake decorations. The first workshop will run on Monday 12th October from 10am – 1pm and will cost £35, to include all ingredients and materials. Coco's will also be running Half Term Cookery Sessions for children on Monday 26th and Tuesday 27th October. Sessions will run from 10am to 12.30 pm and from 1.30pm - 4pm. We will be making fresh homemade pizza and pasta in the morning and making & decorating cupcakes in the afternoon. The Show was a great success – there were over 175 entries and once more we had many new entrants, particularly from the younger families in the village.

The Auction was a triumph thanks to Andy Fisher's auctioning skills. One bunch of tomatoes fetched a staggering £6 and enjoyed a well-deserved round of applause! Over £150 was raised for the Association funds.

Community Centre Update

Apologies first, as it has a been a while since the Village Consultation Exercise that was carried out to gather the views of the Barrowby community on the way forward for the Community Centre joint venture. Since March a lot has happened and things are moving, even if it seems at a slow pace:

- Rebuild costs have been sent off to the insurers so that they can finalise their sums
- Deeds found for the land ownership
- Meeting held with Royal British Legion County Management Board (CMB) hierarchy
- RBL CMB letter to RBL Barrowby Branch with an Agreement in Principle for its support for the project
- Possible donation of the land owned by the RBL to the community of Barrowby.

The insurers of the RBL Club want to pay out for the rebuild and to close off the claim, but they need to know that the Barrowby RBL Club is still strong and wishes to continue with the rebuild; because of this a new Club committee has to be formed. A possible chairman has been asked to form a committee, but this will need to be formulated properly, and whoever it is will require the support of others from within the local community.

To this end it is asked of those current RBL members who live in Barrowby, those who would like to join the RBL so as to become a member of the newly forming Club and/or committee, or anyone that would just like to get more information on the Community Centre joint venture, that they attend an open door evening on **Wednesday 14th October at the Memorial Hall starting at 7.30pm**. Attendees will be able to talk directly to individuals involved in the Community Centre project and get a better and more current update. Tea, coffee and nibbles will be available on the evening.

Hedgehog Welfare By Ralph and Judith Poore

It is always a thrill to see a hedgehog snuffling in your garden at dusk but it is becoming rarer and rarer as hedgehogs are decreasing in numbers. This is particularly caused by road deaths but can also be due to illness and infections from ticks etc.

There are a number of Hedgehog Hospitals in the East Midlands and our nearest hedgehog care facility is Hedgehog Welfare at Foston.

We found our small hoglet, Pierce, sleeping during the day on his own in the middle of our lawn. This is not the usual behaviour for hedgehogs so we contacted Hedgehog Welfare and took him to Foston.



There he was cared for by Janet Peto and her team of volunteers, first in intensive care and then in a walled garden.

After his treatment and when he had put on weight we had him back in a hedgehog box in the garden. We have not seen him since but if anyone should see a hedgehog with a white mark on his back that is Pierce and we would be glad to have news of him.

Hedgehog Welfare are having their Annual Fundraising event at Foston Village Hall on Sunday September 27th from 13.30 to 16.15pm.

Pop along and learn more about these helpful garden creatures and how you can ensure their survival.

Remember do not feed them bread or milk and be careful when disturbing piles of leaves in case they are hibernating.
