#### **Playground Equipment Forum Update**

On the recommendation of Barrowby Playground Equipment Forum, Barrowby Parish Council has appointed Proludic as the preferred supplier for the new play equipment at Adam Stiles and the Village Green.

The Forum's display at the Barrowby Showcase event was very well received and there was lots of feedback from villagers which will be helpful to the forum in refining the design. The Forum will now begin discussions with Proludic to firm up the designs, layouts and the detail of the play equipment itself. The project is still on schedule to begin installation in October 2016.

#### **Grantham Canal Society's Award Event**

On Friday 8th April Sir David White presented awards to individuals and organisations that had supported the restoration of the Grantham Canal over the past decades. These awards were presented in the historic Hickling Warehouse, courtesy of the owner, Cherry Bishop.

The presentation took the form of an original, computer enhanced artwork created by the artist, Barry

Farmer. The picture shows Longmoor Bridge which is one of the two skew bridges unique to the Grantham Canal and not found anywhere else in the UK.

The Grantham Canal Society was formed some 50 years ago to fight the then proposed closure of the Grantham Canal. Since then they have toiled tirelessly to promote this beautiful canal and continue to work to preserve its heritage by diligent and careful restoration.
