Barrowby CE Primary School - January Update

Earlier this term, our Year 5 and 6 children were lucky enough to take part in a Hindusim/India day. They then produced some stunning symmetrical Rangoli Art work using stencils, coloured chalk and black sugar paper.

The White Swan is now ACV listed

It is great news that The White Swan now has been listed as an Asset of Community Value with SKDC, restricting the ability for developers to change its use in the future. Planning permission now needs to be given before the White Swan can be demolished or its use changed, giving us in Barrowby the opportunity to object or even buy The White Swan ourselves to protect it. Although, as landlord John Fairhurst can reassure us, there are currently NO plans to sell The White Swan John is adamant that pubs need to be protected for their communities.
