Standing room only as Barrowby's Neighbourhood Planning process gets underway

It was standing room only at the first meeting, as 110 villagers packed into the Memorial Hall to listen to Parish Council Chair, Richard Cross, describing the process of creating a Neighbourhood Plan for Barrowby. The Plan will help Barrowby develop a shared vision of the future of the village, shaping its development and growth. It can inform where we might want new homes to be sited and where we are seeking improvements in infrastructure. It can mediate between competing land use demands, identify areas that the village would like to see protected from development and look at ways to reduce the need to travel for work and shopping. What it can't do is prevent closure of schools or commercial amenities or specify particular developers.

How does the Planning process work?

SKDC came to the second meeting, describing their role and explaining how SKDC can and will support Barrowby throughout the process. Visit the SKDC web site and http://locality.org.uk/projects/building-community to read more about other Plans and the process itself. After the plan has been produced it is inspected by an Independent Examiner before it is put to the village to be adopted in a local referendum. At least 50% of those villagers voting would need to be in favour for the plan to be adopted. The process usually takes between 18 – 24 months and there is funding of up to £9,000 available to cover costs of consultants etc.

What might Barrowby need to consider?

The SKDC 2036 plan has identified three sites in the village and part of a fourth site on Sheepwash Lane within the parish, for around 250 new houses. The three sites are: along Low Road to the A1, south of Reedings Road and north of Low Road. A lively discussion identified a number of concerns from villagers, mainly about potential increased traffic and lack of car parking and it was agreed that many of the issues raised would be covered within the Plan forum.

What Next?

After the first two meetings, it has been decided to continue with the process, feeling that the creation of a Neighbourhood Plan would give Barrowby more influence within the SKDC planning process. The next meeting to set up a Steering Group will be on **May 23rd at 7.30pm in the Reading Room**. All welcome.

Do you want to become involved? Nearly half the people at the meeting signed up at the first meeting to become part of the Plan process in some way.

A range of skills is required: particularly in areas such as policy writing, publicity, data collation and analysis, project planning or just as a keen supporter and willing helper.
