There were 23 scarecrows to find and 13 garage sales dotted around the village, and the activities on the village green were well supported, including the Gardeners Association produce stall, tombola, second hand book stall, W.I. and handicrafts. The team from the Neighbourhood Planning group were kept busy both days, and All Saints Church had a steady stream of visitors to their refreshments and activities. Well over 200 burgers and hot dogs were served up at the BBQ on Sunday afternoon, with Charlie's Ant entertaining families who were picnicking and dancing on the green in the glorious evening sun.

The organisers would like to thank everyone who supported the event, including all of the sponsors, scarecrow builders (they were all fantastic!), volunteers on stalls and the BBQ, and all who contributed with tombola items and with books



for the book stall. Our grateful thanks in particular go to the Scarecrow judges, Patsy and Martin, who stepped in at very short notice as unfortunately the retired Mayor was not well enough to attend. The judges commented that 'Entries to the annual scarecrow competition were of a very high standard, and were great fun to see'. Last but not least a huge thank you to all of you who came and contributed through spending on the stalls and various activities, and the BBQ. A total of just over £1400 was raised again this year through your generosity, and your support enables the Barrowby News to continue for another year.

## **Around the Parish**

#### **Parish Council News**

Barrowby Parish Council met on Monday 9th September after its summer recess (no meeting in August). Becky Heyward has been appointed as the new Clerk following Nikki Gascoigne's decision to move to full-time employment. Philip Cupit was unanimously elected as the new Chairman following the resignation of Richard Cross in July. Thanks were offered to Richard for the contribution he has made to the Parish Council in recent years.

## **Planning Issues**

Following the recent shock news that SKDC are planning to build 230+ dwellings on the land from Low Road to Dysart Road, we were surprised to hear that Persimmon Homes were holding a public consultation meeting on September 17th regarding proposals for approximately 90 homes to be built on the land behind Leys Close, Reedings Road and Hurst Crescent. This represents a 100% increase in what was originally proposed for this parcel of land.

Whilst the Parish Council is not totally opposed to all development in the village, in common with many parishioners, we share the view that development on the scale being proposed is disproportionate and unacceptable to a village the size of Barrowby as we would be at risk of losing our village identity. The Parish Council urges all those residents with a view on the proposals to make their views known to SKDC and other parties through the consultation process.

## SKDC - Planning Consultation - Statement of Community Involvement

South Kesteven District Council gave notice on 11 September that they have begun consultation on the Draft Statement of Community Involvement 2018. The consultation will run from the 11 September 2018 until the 23 October 2018. Representations must be received before 11:59pm on the 23 October 2018 to be considered.

Annual Vegetable and Flower Show triumphs despite the hot weather

Despite the hot and dry weather defeating many of the flowers and vegetables this season, allotment holders and Barrowby villagers still managed to produce some wonderful entries in the Flower and Vegetable Show held in the Memorial Hall on the August Bank Holiday Saturday.

Although the total number of entries was slightly down on previous years, as usual the standard was very high.

Long-time plot holder Sylvia Markham won Best in Show and Best in Show Vegetable with three large aubergines. Krystyna Fisher won Most Points Chrysanthemums and the Arthur Pearson Rose Bowl, with Nigel Jones winning Most Member's Points and Best Other Vegetable with a striking (though inedible) gourd (see photo), although no-one was quite sure what you could do with it afterwards...and William Linley won the Junior Champion Trophy. Alan Smith won Open Most Points, Best in Show Flowers, Best Exhibit and Most Points Dahlias and Top Tray. The auction was ably



hosted by Andrew Fisher and the event raised funds for the Barrowby Gardeners Association. The Association would like to thank visitors, all of the sponsors and donators of raffle prizes.

To commemorate the centenary of the end of WW1 Barrowby Church will be holding an exhibition -"Barrowby Remembers" over Remembrance weekend. The exhibition, which will feature stories of Barrowby villagers who served in the Great War as well as stories of relatives of current Barrowby residents, will run from 2-4 on Saturday 10 November and 12-4 on Sunday 11 November (Starting directly after our annual Service of Remembrance which begins at 10.45am) We are also very pleased to announce that we have been granted funding by the Armed Forces Covenant Fund for the purchase of 10 perspex "There but Not There" silhouettes which will be placed around church.
