Barrowby Scoops Best Kept Village Title with a near Perfect Score!

A score of 146 out of a possible maximum of 150 Points ensured that Barrowby was the winner of the 'Past Winners' category in Lincolnshire's Best Kept Village competition 2019.

The village received two visits in August, and was judged in a total of 10 areas, including overall appearance and condition, green spaces, public, private and business premises, and overall community effort. The judges had high praise for Barrowby residents: "People obviously put a great deal of effort and time into caring for their village".

The judges awarded maximum points in the areas of Public Domain/Street Scene, Green Spaces, and Public and Religious Premises. The churchyard was commended for being "well maintained with a wildlife area managed" - and the allotments and children's play area were both mentioned for being well looked after and maintained.

It was particularly pleasing for the village to have been awarded maximum points for Overall Community Effort, with the organisation of the Scarecrow Festival and the Annual Produce Show mentioned.

The Parish Council would like to thank all householders (and dog walkers!) for playing their part in ensuring that Barrowby was looking at its best when the judges visited. Barrowby will receive a certificate and brass plaque which will be displayed in due course. The result is testament to the pride we all take in our village, gardens and our wider community spaces. Thank you!!

Community Speed Watch

The Parish Council is considering a Community Speed Watch scheme to tackle speeding issues in Barrowby. This involves using highly visible passive notices and battery powered speed indicators to reinforce the speed limit. Drivers' speeds are captured by authorised local volunteers at approved locations. The registered keeper of any vehicle caught exceeding the speed limit is sent a letter from the police.

The Parish Council needs a team of volunteers if Barrowby is going to be able to run a Community Speed Watch scheme. This is **three squads of three people** willing to commit both to initial training and to data capturing on a regular basis (at least once every three weeks). What are the results of the Neighbourhood Plan questionnaire? Meet Community Lincs, OpenPlan and the team on Monday 2nd December

With a response rate higher than average Barrowby residents are making their views clear:

What people like about Barrowby: friendly; open spaces; surrounding countryside

What is most important to people in Barrowby: open spaces; meeting places — almost 75% would support a new community facility; outdoor facilities for older children; all the shops are important; many would like to see a doctor's surgery.

New houses: Over 70% want **no more** than the proposed 49 houses; little support for further greenfield development; 3 bedroom houses and bungalows preferred.

Keep: Separation from Grantham; rural views; integrity and character of village.

What else did we say? What happens now? Come to the drop-in session from 4—8 p.m. at the Reading Room to have your say and discuss issues and problems in the parish.

AROUND THE PARISH

WI — BARROWBY BENEATH OUR FEET

Barrowby has been lived in for over 10,000 years. Over 30 WI members and guests were enthralled to learn about the flints and scrapers of the Stone Age, the ploughed out burial mounds of the Bronze Age, the flour grinding stones of the Iron Age and the possibility of as yet undiscovered Roman remains all lying beneath our feet in the parish.

Using maps and showing some of the finds over the years, local resident Nigel Jones, and John Gorrey, both members of the Grantham Archaeology Group, described how archaeologists use old maps, photographs and laser detection from the air, field walking and metal detecting to identify features in the local landscape to show how Barrowby has been inhabited over the millennia. Some of these features are being lost through housing development and Nigel hopes to return to the Parish Boundary Project to identify the old boundary markers in cooperation with local landowners.

There are 9 Stone Age sites, one is a ring ditch near the canal by the A1, and two ploughed out Bronze Age burial mounds, one of which is on the left hand side along the Drift towards Harlaxton. The local area was very important in Roman times and members were interested to see Roman wall plaster that has been found at a site not 5 miles from Barrowby. Nigel and John are convinced that Barrowby (Anglo-Saxon for 'farmstead on the hill') was lived in throughout the Iron and Roman

Ages before 'coming alive' in the Anglo-Saxon period. An Anglo-Saxon cross in the church wall and a coffin are two remnants of a time when Barrowby was in a wealthy landscape and was a thriving village of 300 people. To learn more contact Nigel on 07801 905690.

It's been well over six months since Barrowby Parish went into a vacancy, following the retirement of Rev. Peter Hopkins. So how are things going?

We're very happy to say that there's a lot of good news: we are continuing to maintain our pattern of services, with only a few minor amendments, and our church family is working and worshipping together faithfully. Our children's and young peoples' groups continue to flourish, as do our Families Services, and a particular joy this summer has been the Confirmation of another five of our young people.

We held two very successful events this summer the Strawberry Tea, and the Scarecrow Festival where we saw record visitors. Phase 1 of the re-ordering of the church interior is now complete, and we have a lovely space to use at the back of church. Phase 2 — the replacement of the rest of the 'pews' with chairs — is planned for the Spring and grants are being applied for.

Progress towards being able to advertise for a new Rector is slower as there are a number of important decisions to be made before we can do so.
