Barrowby Housing Development: Planning Inspector on 22nd May

In 2018, SKDC increased the proposed allocation of new houses for Barrowby in their draft Local Plan for the period 2011-36 from a notional 89 to a notional 230 units. This was done at the very last moment, and without consultation or community engagement.

In reality, the numbers of houses will be higher than these notional allocations – they could easily total between 400 and 500 new houses on the three sites proposed by SKDC.

SKDC submitted their plan to the Government for authority and there will be a Public Examination of the proposals in May, in front of a Government–appointed Planning Inspector.

The Neighbourhood Plan Group, the Parish Council and some individuals have registered to give evidence about the SKDC proposals, and the issues they raise, at the session relating to Barrowby to be held on May 22nd.

Other Neighbourhood Plan work is currently paused, partly to help deal with this, and partly because it is not permissible to hold the planned public consultation during a pre-election period.

Annual Parish Open Meeting

The Annual Parish Meeting will be held on
Monday 20th May at 7.00 p.m. at the Reading Room.

This meeting is open to all electors who are welcome to attend and to speak on any matter of local interest. Organised for the benefit of the community, the meeting will be presided over by the Chair of the Parish Council who will present a review of Parish Council activities, talk about the future and take questions with discussion. The Parish Council will then invite local organisations to make short presentations on their activities in the village to be followed by any personal representations and refreshments.

All local electors are welcome.

BARROWBY VETS

By the time you read this the **VETS** (**V**olunteer **E**mergency **T**elephone **S**ervice) will be active within the village. Nine volunteers have undergone training to assist where needed in cases of medical, life threatening emergencies in the village.

If you are involved in a medical emergency the first thing to do is dial 999. As soon as you have done this, the emergency services will respond. Meanwhile you can also summon local emergency support by dialling the VETS number to call upon the support of Barrowby volunteers who will assist you until the medical professionals arrive. Their support may take the form of bringing a defibrillator to your house or supporting you in CPR (Cardiac Pulmonary Resuscitation) until the paramedics are able to attend. Where the situation is NOT life-threatening you can choose to either call an ambulance or convey the casualty to A&E by your car or alternative means of transport.

The telephone number to summon the aid of the **VETS** will be distributed to households via the cards included either in this edition or in the June edition of the Barrowby News.

Since the Parish Council sponsored defibrillators were installed two years ago, they have been deployed on two occasions. **VETS** is intended to ensure that anyone living within 500m of a defibrillator has the best possible chance of survival in a medical, life threatening emergency.
