## PARISH OPEN MEETING - MONDAY 20TH MAY

Record attendance as 12 village groups present at Parish Open Meeting

Chair of the Parish Council, Phil Cupit, welcoming 22 parishioners to the open meeting, outlined the key issues facing Barrowby in the next 12 months, including the potential sale of the RBL site, the Neighbourhood Plan and the impact of up to 400 new homes, an increase of 50%. A consultant has been employed to help with representations to the Planning Inspector as the Council continue to resist development at the proposed scale. The Parish Council also intend to develop a new website.



Presentations came from Barrowby News, and from

Grantham Canal, who described their 20-year restoration project, spending £1 million and requiring 7,000 volunteer days so far. The Neighbourhood Plan Group described their focus on the development, outlining the need for a 'Max' Plan, including a 'Design Code' to influence future housing. The Allotments have plans for an Apple and Wassail Day, creating an orchard, and Barrowby Baptists outlined their Monday Cane and Abel mornings with quizzes, talks, popular Summer Strawberry teas and soup lunches. The church explained that there will not be a new vicar for 12 months, and in the interim woodworm-riddled pews are being taken out, giving space for events, and the wildlife churchyard is already a nature haven. Barrowby Open Door clarified the requirements of their film 'umbrella' license. Delighted at the audience sizes, they will be expanding the social side with other organisations. Finally the Sequence Dance Club, football and youth cricket clubs extolled the virtues of their activities for physical health.

## **Barrowby Expansion**

The Government appointed Planning
Inspector has held a number of hearings to
examine the soundness of SKDC's new Local
Plan. It is this plan that has proposed a massive
development on the south east of the village.
Barrowby Parish Council, Barrowby
Neighbourhood Planning Steering Group and a

number of individuals have made representations to the Inspector, claiming that whilst some housing development is inevitable, the scale of what is being proposed is far beyond what the residents of Barrowby consider to be acceptable. The impact of such a large development on the nature and character of Barrowby would mean that Barrowby becomes a

suburb of Grantham rather than maintaining its own distinct village identity. We await the Inspector's findings to see if the proposed development has been reduced in size. *Chair, Parish Council.*

## **Barrowby VETS**

Barrowby VETS (Volunteer Emergency Telephone System) is now operational. In the case of a medical emergency **first DIAL 999** to summon the emergency services. **Next dial 500180** and you will be contacted by a volunteer helper who will arrive at your house prepared to assist you with anything from making a cup of tea to administering assistance with heart massage. **It is essential that you dial 999 first.** 

The telephone number for VETS will appear on posters around the village and be distributed via the Barrowby News as well as individual "business cards" in the Village Link. The Barrowby VETS is meant to be a supplementary service to the 999 service not a replacement for it!

## It's Best Kept Village time again!

This is the last year in which Barrowby will be judged within the Past Winners Category. Judging is throughout August, but Brian Inglis asks that everyone starts NOW to help keep Barrowby tidy by **trimming hedges and cutting grass**. Please remember that the Wildlife and Countryside Act of 1981 means the destruction of birds' nests and their young is illegal, so hedges can only be lightly trimmed before 31st July.
