Why are we developing a Neighbourhood Plan?

- 1. The Neighbourhood Plan is a communityled strategy for influencing sustainable development in Barrowby.
- 2. The plan will contain detailed priorities for development, such as the preservation of green space or the provision of low-cost housing.
- 3. SKDC must take into account the policies

and priorities set out in the Plan when proposing or making decisions on future development.

- 4. The plan is **your** opportunity to help shape the future of the community we live in.
- 5. The questionnaire is an important part of the process.

Please note that the questionnaire cannot be issued until after the local government elections on 2nd May. The timescale will be outlined in the next issue of Barrowby News.

The very mild February weather provided a wonderful show of snowdrops in the churchyard this year, along with aconites, violets, primulas and early signs of the bluebells and cowslips to come.

Wildflower seeds set last autumn are being pricked out and grown on to add to

the 70 plus species of flowering plants that we identified last year, and new bird boxes have been put up ready for spring and the nesting season.

Winter may still have more to give us, but the grass is growing and cutting will start again soon.
