NEIGHBOURHOOD PLAN UPDATE: SUCCESSFUL FEEDBACK AND 'VISION' EVENT: WHAT NEXT?

Over 80 villagers came to All Saint's Church at the start of December to hear feedback on the recent Questionnaire and to participate in helping shape the 'Vision' for the Neighbourhood Plan, much to the satisfaction of Community Lincs and OpenPlan who would like to thank everyone for their support.

What did the consultation conclude?

Community and the Environment

People value and want to protect the characteristics of Barrowby that identify it as a village e.g. the green spaces and play areas, footpaths and access to the open countryside. Continued separation from Grantham is essential. There was support for a new community centre and better leisure and recreational facilities. Many respondents consider Barrowby to be a friendly and safe place to live.

Housing and Employment

The questionnaire did not identify any immediate housing need beyond some potential for some smaller properties within the next five years. There is little support for many more houses than the 49 already granted planning permission. Three-bedroom houses and 1-2 bedroom bungalows are seen as needed most. There were many concerns related to any future development, especially traffic and parking difficulties. There was some support for a retail business although 75% of responders do not feel that Barrowby needs more employment opportunities.

Traffic and Transport

There was support for measures that may reduce some of the current traffic problems, such as ample parking for any new community facility, new houses to have at least 2 parking spaces and parking restrictions in the village. A majority would like to see more frequent public transport into Grantham, but the car was for most the regular form of transport.

What next? Our advisers, Community Lincs and Open Plan, are currently analyzing the results of the feedback session and Vision exercise. Our next priority is to create a 'Neighbourhood Profile' and undertake a Local Green Space Assessment in early 2020, with an aim to complete the Plan during the coming year. So watch this space!

BARROWBY - A PLASTIC-FREE COMMUNITY?

We live in a plastic world. It's an extraordinarily useful, versatile, cheap material. And it's everywhere. Barrowby Parish Council propose to investigate the benefits of Surfers Against Sewage's Plastic-Free Community Initiative and to look at working together as a community to kick our addiction to avoidable single-use plastic. If we can make sure we don't choke our streets, parks and playgrounds with it today, we can avoid it being in our rivers tomorrow, and our beaches and oceans forever.

The Plastic-Free Community Initiative requires that a community puts in place the following five key elements and is moving ahead to tackle single-use waste across the area:

- Creating a community steering group to build support.
- Commitment from Local Government (Parish Council).
- Working with the community, for example getting schools to ban plastic.
- Working with local businesses to take further action.
- Running community clean up events.

Don't drive through flood water, just 30cm is enough to move your car and risk your safety. Flood water can contain sewage and other harmful substances. Where possible avoid contact with, and keep pets away from, flood water. Always wear waterproof clothing, gloves, wellington boots and a face mask if contact is unavoidable.
