During lockdown Parish Council meetings have successfully been held online via Zoom. However, the Government has refused to extend the law to allow future meetings to be held online so the Parish Council has now resumed face to face monthly public meetings.

ANNUAL PARISH MEETING

Praise for Barrowby's Community efforts

The Chair of the Parish Council summarised what has been enacted by the Parish Council during 2020 and their plans for 2021-2022:

- The Reading Room has been painted and Pavilion maintained. It is hoped to refurbish the kitchen in the Reading Room
- The Parish Council propose to consult further with residents regarding the mandate to purchase the British Legion site
- The Parish Council is pursuing Section 106 development money for the community from SKDC and the housing developers
- Consultations will take place with SKDC and LCC about parking and potholes in the village
- The Parish Council will continue to seek a separation from Grantham and retain the village character whilst also developing the village economy
- The Parish Council intend to hold another Barrowby Showcase event, previously organised by Barrowby News team members.

Local organisations including the Neighbourhood Plan Group, the Barrowby Baptist Fellowship, All Saints Church, the Grantham Ramblers and Grantham Canal as well as the Barrowby Football Club and Barrowby News provided updates on their activities.

The Chair thanked all the village residents for their efforts within the community during the pandemic, particularly those in the Community Resilience Group. Barrowby should be proud of its community spirit.

HOUSING DEVELOPMENT NAMES

SKDC asked the Parish Council for suggestions for names with a local connection for the new housing development. A small working group of Councillors and residents met on Zoom and have provided a choice of road names to SKDC.

Unfortunately, the village could not be consulted more widely due to the tight timescales from SKDC.

LOCAL CLUBS SLOWLY RE-STARTING
