# BARROWBY STRIKES GOLD! Third time winners of Best Kept Village gains us a gold litter bin

Barrowby has won the Best Kept Village three times: 2016, 2019 and 2020 (the last jointly with Allington). This is a tremendous achievement for a large, diverse village such as ours and is testament to the work of dedicated volunteers and the whole community for its commitment to keeping the village neat, tidy, and flourishing with events and social activities for all ages.

The question is: 'What will we get for winning it a fourth time?'!



#### **PARISH COUNCIL NEWS**

Please help to keep our pavements and footpaths clear, particularly for those with pushchairs and wheelchairs. As the birds are not nesting, now is the perfect time to cut back hedges and vegetation which are encroaching on paths. Thank you for your help.

#### **49 HOUSES: CHANGES GRANTED BY SKDC**

South Kesteven District Council has granted the changes requested by the developers to allow for 49 small affordable houses, without garages, and space for a future retail outlet off Low Road.

This is disappointing as the MasterPlan required by the Planning Inspector has not yet been made public. Barrowby News will continue to keep the village up-to-date with developments.


#### 2019

#### 2020

In a dismal year, Barrowby's community spirit has won through with a fantastic response to the Covid crisis.

- The Community Resilience Group, coordinated by Phil and Jane Cupit, welcomed more than 80 volunteers to support the Barrowby Community by walking the whole village daily to check cards in windows, collecting shopping, walking dogs and talking to the isolated and vulnerable.
- Plot holders on the allotments dug, planted, harvested and delivered produce around the village from June to September, in addition to their own plots. 'Thank you, you lovely allotment people' said one elderly woman who lives on her own.
- Barrowby won the Best Kept Village award for the third time!
