# **AROUND THE PARISH**

#### **BARROWBY PARISH COUNCIL NEWS**

Barrowby Parish Council currently has 8 councillors, with Nigel Eaton being elected as Chair, and Tim Lees as Vice-Chair.

The new Parish Council faces one of the most challenging terms in recent history. The parish will broadly double in size, with new building projects planned. Grantham Town Council's proposals threaten Barrowby Parish boundaries, and the maintenance of local services in the midst of a cost of living crisis are key issues we all face.

Come along to meet your Parish Councillors to discuss any issues, over coffee and biscuits.

### Council Tax and Parish Council Precept 2023/24

At the beginning of 2023 the Parish Council considered the detailed budget and the Precept request (the amount the Parish Council requires for meeting the expenses of running the Council) for the year 2023/24. At the latest meeting the budget of £99,145 was agreed with a £58,000 precept. This took into account the range of Parish responsibilities including maintenance of the Sports Pavilion, Reading Room, Burial Ground, Allotments and play areas (a lot of which was previously done by volunteers who we no longer have), village grass cutting, weed spraying and financial reserves. The Parish Council also has responsibility for maintaining the day to day running of the village meeting facilities, with ever increasing costs for things such as electricity and gas bills and contractor's costs, some of which have been offset by increasing hire charges.

The Parish had been given the Tax Base figure (broadly, the number of Band D equivalent dwellings in the village) by SKDC which was estimated at 828.30; this was an increase from 729.20 the previous year. Following the calculations, it was agreed to increase the Precept to £58,000 which is an increase of £14,000. The annual cost to a Band D household would be approximately £70.02 – an increase of just £9.72 over the whole year and equivalent to 81 pence a month.

#### **Coronation Celebrations**

On the lead up to the Coronation, various members of the school family were invited to make their very own Coronation flag. These flags were strung together to decorate the school with its very own Coronation Bunting.

On Friday 5th May, the whole school family came together to celebrate the King's Coronation with

a commemorative photograph. This sees staff, Governors and children make the shape of His Majesty's Crown, as well as Year 6 children (with help from some Year 5 children) forming the Coronation date - see front page.

During the afternoon, the school held a special Coronation Collective Worship, which saw the children process to the hall wearing their very own crowns which they had made during the week.

#### In other news

Earlier in April representatives from Year 3 and 4 classes competed against 18 other local Primary Schools in and around Grantham in the Boys and Girl's Cross Country Events. The Girl's team came 2<sup>nd</sup> and the Boy's team came 1<sup>st</sup>, which means that Barrowby Primary School came in 1<sup>st</sup> place overall.
