COMMUNITY INITIATIVE HAS THE SUPPORT OF BARROWBY RESIDENTS

The meeting on March 6th to discuss volunteering to maintain the flowerbeds in the village was well attended, with over 20 residents and representatives of village groups present.

Representing the Parish Council, Phil Cupit explained that although Barrowby had decided not to enter the Best Kept Village Competition, SKDC had taken the decision to enter all villages anyway, at no cost to the villages. He explained that the Parish Council had considered the responses to the consultation document and wanted to honour the wishes of the respondents.



In particular, some beds would be considered as herbaceous perennials and the beds by the Reading Room would remain as annual bedding plants.

There was plenty of discussion about which areas of the village might be managed, and suggestions were shared as to how the initiative will work, both in terms of Parish Council support and autonomy for those taking on responsibility for specific beds and borders. It was suggested that a WhatsApp group should be set up within which volunteers might communicate with each other.

Fifteen volunteers offered to take on responsibility for various flower beds, with three local businesses offering sponsorship of flower beds.

There will definitely be a different look to the flower beds this summer, with some plants being offered from cuttings taken at home and some being purchased.

The Parish Council is extremely grateful to those who attended the meeting, and committed their time and effort to planting and maintaining village flower beds this summer.

BARROWBY GARDENERS' ASSOCIATION TIPS

Plant Gladioli corms.

Plant early potatoes beginning of the month; second earlies near the end of the month.

At the end of the month sow Brussels sprouts, cabbage and cauliflower.

Sow early round seeded peas.

Under cover sow radish and spring onion seeds. Sow Parsnip seeds; only use new seeds. Try sowing 3 seeds into the centre of a toilet roll holder filled with compost: place it in a seed tray until germinated before planting out.

In the Greenhouse sow Tomato and Aubergine, Sweet Peppers and half hardy annuals.
