BARROWBY PARISH COUNCIL - A MESSAGE FROM THE NEW CHAIR

Firstly, to those of you who have recently moved into the Village, a very warm welcome!

It has been a busy period for the Parish Council, with new Councillors and a new Chair, following the retirement of Councillor Cupit at May's elections. We all owe him a great debt of gratitude for steering the ship so well through some stormy seas. His support continues for the neighbourhood plan and for the Barrowby in Bloom volunteer initiative, which has been a great success. Thanks to all the volunteers, the flowerbeds and planters around the Village are looking magnificent.

In July we approved the repair of the play equipment on the Village Green, at considerable cost. We have appointed a new contractor to take care of these repairs and to maintain the equipment ongoing. We know how popular this is and we will do all we can to maintain it to the highest standard.

Can I please take this opportunity to remind everyone that the Village Green is for everyone's use, and to respect the area, the equipment on it and of course our neighbours who live close by. Please report any anti-social behaviour to the Neighbourhood Policing team by calling 101.

We have agreed that this area needs more attention and community engagement, and we have decided to set up a community working party specifically relating to the green areas and play equipment. Recently we met with the builders of the proposed new developments at Rectory Farm on Barrowby Road and Low Road. This was to view their proposals and to outline our concerns, especially the strain that some 600+ new households will put on our limited local services, also the poor and unsafe access routes

for pedestrians and cyclists into the Village; more on that to follow.

I am pleased to confirm that thanks to Councillor Andy Marriott we have moved into the Social Media age and launched our new Barrowby Parish Council Facebook page. Please use this for local information and an alternative way to contact us.

Finally, I hope you all have a great Summer, July's weather notwithstanding.

We will be back for business with our next Parish Council meeting in The Reading Room on Monday September 11th.

SPOTLIGHT ON.... PET FIRST AID

Back in 2019 Sara Barnes was struggling to find an in person pet first aid course locally, so decided to go and train to become an instructor herself. She is now offering a formally recognised Level 2 qualification. Each four hour course takes place at the Reading Room in Barrowby, from 10 am to 2 pm. Most of the theory and practical work is focused on what to do on a dog, but the principles apply to all dogs, cats and small pets.

Each student will receive their own set of equipment for use during the course and a certificate on completion. The next course is on Saturday 14th October. As Sara herself says, 'With the increase in pet ownership over the period of the pandemic, I personally feel it is more important than ever that owners know how to do basic first aid on their pet and also have the skills to save their pet's life, should something unfortunate happen.'

GARDENERS' ASSOCIATION TIPS

- Cut blooms of sweet peas regularly to prevent them going to seed
- Sow spring cabbage, japanese onion, spinach and lettuce for early spring use
- Check sweet corn cobs for picking later in the month.
- Hoe regularly to prevent weed seeds
- Remember to turn compost bins to guicken the composting cycle
- Cut the tops out of runner beans when they reach the top of the supports; this helps them to bush out
- Leave greenhouse doors open in the day time to help air flow and prevent blight
- Remove the growing point of tomatoes when they are at the desired height
- Take cuttings of Regal Geraniums
