### GARDENERS' ASSOCIATION TIPS



Sow lettuce for over wintering with cloche protection.

Lift main crop carrots for storage.

Plant spring cabbage.

Sow parsley to provide a spring crop.

Take cuttings of fuchsias and pelargoniums.

Remove any shading from the greenhouse.

Harvest blackberries and loganberries: cut away old growth and tie in new.

Complete summer pruning of apples and pears.

Start planning for next year's seeds to sow.

Cut Lavender back a third but not into the old wood.
