BARROWBY NEIGHBOURHOOD PLANNING GROUP - UPDATE

Work continued on the preparation of the Neighbourhood Plan throughout 2023, and we are now within sight of the finishing line. We aim to have the draft plan completed and ready for consultation with residents later in the year.

The last stage in the completion of the plan will be a referendum of the parish electorate to see if the majority of the village inhabitants wish to adopt the plan.

The Neighbourhood Planning Group will produce regular reports in the coming months to explain the progress and to give advance notice of any

consultation opportunities.

GARDENERS' ASSOCIATION TIPS

- * Plant or split rhubarb and spread straw/manure over, and cover existing plants with a box or pot to encourage growth.
- * Sow broad beans outdoors if weather permits, or sow in trays and keep in a cool dry place.
- Continue pruning fruit trees and bushes, clearing away cuttings.

The social group Cane and Able was started over twenty years ago by Faye Harrison to support the more senior members of the Barrowby community, particularly those who live alone. Today there are around forty members who meet on a Monday from 10 – 11am in the Memorial Hall. Once a month, on a Wednesday, the group share a meal.

The group have a number of activities to entertain their members. They have had speakers covering a wide range of topics, including topical subjects, such as energy advice. Present members have also been able to entertain the group by sharing tales from their own life stories. They have had musical items such as a ukulele band, and in January they have invited Jeanette Machin from Move It 2 Music to



join them. The group gets out and about too and they have recently visited the alpaca farm at Dry Doddington. There are seasonal activities, such as making pancakes on Shrove Tuesday, and in the summer they hold a strawberry high tea. From January to March this year the local Co-op will be championing the group to raise funds for this event. The meetings are £1 to attend and are open to all. The Wednesday meal is covered by a donation.
