The Barrowby Events team are pleased to announce they are hosting a Summer Fête in the village over the Bank Holiday weekend of 24th and 25th August.



There is plenty planned for the weekend including a summer market, a family fun day, live music, hot food and a licensed bar. The event will also continue the longstanding village tradition of hosting the scarecrow competition.

The scarecrow competition will be <u>free</u> to enter and open to all within the Barrowby Parish, including for the first time residents of the Colleys. This year there will be an area designated for displaying scarecrows made by residents who do not live within the village.



The theme this year is Olympics and Paralympics. Time to get planning! As with every year, we cannot wait to see what our residents come up with. We think that the most scarecrows ever made was 33. Could we beat that this year - we hope so!

For the first time this year the scarecrow winners will be decided purely by the public vote.


