

BARROWBY PARISH COUNCIL NEWS

The budget for 2025/2026 has now been set and we are pleased to have been able to limit the increase in the parish precept to 4.9%. This equates to an annual increase of £3.62 for a Band D house.

The housing development on Low Road should break ground this Autumn, having passed from Allison Homes to Taylor Wimpey. It is hoped that the developers will have a stand at the Spring Fayre, 3rd and 4th May, so that you can see what is planned.

The Parish Council have already requested priority on Social Housing to be for people with existing Barrowby connections.

BARROWBY NEIGHBOURHOOD PLAN CONSULTATION



Having launched the Neighbourhood Plan at the public meeting on Friday February 21st, there has already been an encouraging response from Barrowby residents.

IF YOU'VE NOT ALREADY DONE SO - IT'S NOT TOO LATE TO HAVE YOUR SAY!

The Neighbourhood Plan sets out the Vision for Barrowby in the next 20 years. In doing so, it sets out 11 objectives to make the vision a reality, and 8 policies that planners must observe when considering any developments within the Parish. It is based upon the evidence collated from a variety of sources including public consultations.

The Plan can be seen on the Parish Council website, together with the two supporting evidential documents: Barrowby: The Design Codes and Guidance; and Barrowby: Housing Needs Assessment. This latter document was commissioned to assess the housing needs of Barrowby in particular, rather than South Kesteven as a whole.


