HAVE YOUR SAY ON FUTURE HOUSING AND LAND USE – LOCAL PLAN CONSULTATION NOW OPEN

SKDC has launched its Regulation 18 public consultation on proposed housing and mixed-use site allocations. This consultation runs from **Thursday 3rd July to Thursday 28th August 2025** and gives local residents, including those in Barrowby, a key opportunity to help shape the future development of our area. Following feedback on the draft Local Plan earlier this year, SKDC is now consulting on updates to proposed sites and additional new ones aimed at meeting future housing needs. This includes land potentially allocated for housing, employment, and community facilities.

BARROWBY BUS SERVICE CHANGES

The bus service number 6, which used to operate between Bottesford, Barrowby and Grantham, was withdrawn from service on Sunday July 20th because of low passenger usage. There is now a regular bus loop service, no. 86, run by Vectare buses, which is running every hour directly to and from Barrowby to Grantham bus station (stand 10). The service operates Monday to Saturday (reduced Saturday timetable).

First pick up 8:30 a.m. at the White Swan, last pick up at Bus Station 16:25 p.m. (There is no pick up from Grantham at 15.20 because of school transport). The pick up/drop off points in Barrowby are at all of the regular bus stops in the village.

This is now the <u>only</u> bus service between Barrowby and Grantham - the more it is used by residents the better the chance it will be maintained as a regular bus service for the village.

ANNUAL PARISH MEETING REPORT

Around 30 parishioners attended the Annual Parish meeting on Wednesday 25th June, held at the Sports Pavilion. They were able to meet representatives from a number of local groups and organisations, including the Barrowby RAGS group, Grantham Canal Society, Open Door, Barrowby Bellringers, Cane and Able, Barrowby PreSchool and Barrowby CofE School, Barrowby Scouts and Cubs, Martial Arts, and the developers Taylor Wimpey and Persimmon.

The evening started with a discussion led by the Parish Council chair Nigel Eaton regarding the proposed change of use of the Few Trees property on High Road, from a residential property to a home for vulnerable children. Local and district councillors were on hand to answer questions and to explain the planning process. Objections to the change of use have mainly been made by both residents and the Parish Council on the grounds of safeguarding concerns, with the site location not felt to be appropriate for vulnerable children (near A1 sliproad/ A52). The application will now go to full planning for consideration.

BARROWBY PRESCHOOL NEWS

Barrowby PreSchool currently has spaces beginning in September for children aged 2 to 4. Funded places are accepted. Barrowby PreSchool has long been a cherished part of the village. It is a place where young children can grow, play and begin their learning journey in a safe, warm and supportive environment. Volunteers from The Grantham Canal Society very much look forward to welcoming you to their Woolsthorpe depot, on **Sunday 31st August**, where they will be holding their annual **Produce Fair**. If you tend to have a glut of garden produce around this time of year, you could take it along to their Bring and Buy stall. You can saunter around the numerous stalls, enjoy a cuppa and a slice of homemade cake or even grab a tasty burger from the BBQ.

The Canal Society's trip boat 'The Three Shires' will be running 30-minute cruises during the day on a turn up and ride basis. If you have not done this before, a trip is highly recommended – top tip though is get your ticket as soon as you arrive, because the trips are very popular. A trip will cost £5 per adult/£3 per child, babies in arms free. Tickets will be available from the depot, with the boat departing from lock 18 which is the usual mooring spot. Lock 16 is leaking badly, which is why the canal is currently dry near The Duck.

GARDENERS' ASSOCIATION -TIPS FOR AUGUST

When we talk about August it seems like Autumn is just around the corner. But meanwhile we have to look after our plants and produce as they put on a summer flourish.

- Ponds keep replenishing and keep removing excess leaf growth on lilies.
- Container plants feed weekly and water regularly.
- On the veg plot sow spring cabbage and winter lettuce.
- Water runner and french beans and check for blackfly.
- Pinch out growing tips of greenhouse tomatoes and cease feeding.
- Plant rooted strawberry runners.
- Prune plum trees when harvesting has finished.
- Cut back fruited blackberries and loganberries to ground level and tie in new replacement shoots.

BARROWBY BELLRINGERS PERFORM AT THE RINGING WORLD NATIONAL YOUTH CONTEST

On Saturday 5th July 4 Barrowby Bell Ringers took part in the Ringing World National Youth Contest in and around Birmingham. They set off at 8.30 am to ring Walsall's 12 bells. For several of the team this was their first experience of ringing on more than 8 so it offered them a new challenge. Next up was a visit to Erdington to ring their competition piece on an interesting ring of bells. They then headed to Birmingham city centre to ring on the 16 bells at St Martin's in the Bullring. This is one of only 2 towers with 16 bells in the UK (the other being in Dublin) so it was a very rare experience for them and they all rang really well. It is very different ringing on 16 to ringing on 6 which is what most of the Barrowby band are used to. While at St Martin's they also took part in a handbell workshop and were taught an



interesting way to ring a simple method (plain hunt) on 12 bells. The team then moved on to Moseley and had a ring on the 10 bells there, before getting the bus back to St Martin's for the results.

The team (The Lincolnshire Poachers) came joint 11th in their competition (advanced Call Changes on 6). Overall, there were 39 teams who took part on the day in 5 different competitions. They stopped for a well-deserved MacDonalds before heading home!


