BARROWBY COMMUNITY ORCHARD PROPOSAL - YOUR VIEWS WELCOMED

Barrowby Parish Council, together with the RAGS (Recreation and Green Space) working group, is preparing a grant application to the South Kesteven District Council Coronation Community Orchard Scheme. The proposal is to establish a small community orchard of approximately 10 fruit trees on The Willows (Pastures Road). The orchard would feature heritage varieties that reflect the rich horticultural history of our region. The proposed trees will originate from Lincolnshire, Leicestershire and Nottinghamshire, including well-known local favourites such as Bramley apples and a descendant of the Isaac Newton "Flower of Kent" apple tree. We are especially pleased to include a historic apple variety first recorded in Barrowby in the 1850s, giving the orchard a unique local identity and story to share.

The orchard aims to:

- Enhance The Willows as a publicly accessible green space
- Support biodiversity and pollinators
- Provide an educational resource with interpretive signage and QR-linked information about the fruit varieties
- Create opportunities for community involvement, from planting days to future harvesting events
- Act as long-term replacement tree cover in an area affected by ash dieback

The informal football play area will remain unaffected, with tree placement designed to allow the space to continue to be used as it is today.

As part of our grant application, we need to demonstrate local community support. If you would like to see the orchard created – or have any comments – please get in touch. GRANTHAM CANAL SOCIETY NEWS

Why not enjoy a walk over the festive period to check out what has been happening on and around the canal, and round it off nicely with a coffee in The Duck at Woolsthorpe?

Even though winter is supposed to be our 'quiet' season the volunteers have been kept very busy. At last there is plenty of water in the canal following a very dry summer, during which time the Society keeps vegetation removal to a minimum to avoid disturbing the wide variety of wildlife which makes the canal its home.

Since the end of 'bird nest' season, there has been a lot of trimming back of vegetation, reeds and weeds, so a walk along the canal from Woolsthorpe to Denton is now better than ever. Work is ongoing to repair Lock 16 near The Duck at Woolsthorpe, and silt removal continues in the Duck Pound - you can see our new workboat Betty there. The Grantham Canal Partnership is an association of parish and district councils and other interested parties which is being revitalised under the leadership of Robert Leadenham. After an amazing 17 years, Mike Stone has retired as chairman and the role has passed to the capable hands of Anthony Goody, who has been working with Jane (treasurer) developing the new website which will be going live soon. You can still check out granthamcanal.org.

GARDENERS' ASSOCIATION: TIPS FOR JANUARY

There may not be much activity in the garden at the moment, but it is an excellent time to plan a herb border.

Garden Tool Maintenance

- Carry out maintenance on lawn mowers, cultivators, and hedge trimmers to ensure they are in good working order for the coming season.

- Sharpen shears and secateurs so they are ready for use when the gardening year gets underway.

In the Vegetable Plot

- Plant rhubarb crowns.
- Sow broad beans to enjoy an early crop.
- Towards the end of the month, sow peas—choose a round variety for best results—and cover the rows with fleece to protect them from the cold.
- Plant shallots in well-drained soil, making sure they are in a sheltered spot to encourage healthy growth.

Along Mill Row was the site of a village windmill which was disused by 1916 and demolished by the Second World War. There is no trace of the windmill to be seen today, but there is a photograph in Barrowby Reading Room. There was a second, earlier, windmill on the other side of the A52 at the top of Barrowby Hill, called Mill Hill on some maps.

The Old Bakery is a cottage on Casthorpe Road. Barrowby used to have two bakeries, the second being off High Road near what used to be the Post Office.
