MAJOR PLANNING UPDATE

195 NEW HOMES PROPOSED FOR BARROWBY - APPLICATION S25/2471 - YOUR VOICE MATTERS

A major outline planning application has been submitted for up to 195 dwellings on the land West of Grange Paddock and behind Casthorpe Road. This is a significant proposal that would have a long-term impact on the character and infrastructure of our village. At a recent meeting, Barrowby Parish Council voted unanimously to **OBJECT** to the proposal.

WHY THE PARISH COUNCIL IS OBJECTING

Barrowby Action Group (BAG) and Councillors identified five critical areas of concern.

Drainage and Flood Risk: the site's clay soil and sloping ground make drainage difficult. We believe there is a high probability of increased surface-water flooding toward Lowfields and the Pavilion.

Sewage & Water Capacity: Anglian Water has confirmed that the local network is already exceeding acceptable "spill" limits. With no strategic investment planned for our area, Anglian Water has indicated they must also object to ensure an effective service.

Threat to Endangered Wildlife: the site is home to **Skylarks**, a Red Listed species. The developers' own ecology report admits that the scheme would permanently destroy nesting habitats, causing harm that cannot be mitigated locally.

Traffic & Safety: our roads are already under pressure during school runs and community events. Adding 195 homes to the cumulative effect of two other housing projects in the area would significantly impact traffic and pedestrians.

Environmental Health: increased noise, air and light pollution. This is our access to the countryside and part of Barrowby's rural identity.

Parish Poll (2025): residents' views were clear - the Barrowby Parish Poll clearly showed residents oppose major developments in the parish. This remains an important marker of the strength of feeling locally.

BUS SERVICE 86 UPDATE: BARROWBY-GRANTHAM

Residents may be aware that as from **Sunday 1st February 2026** the Bus Service 86 will no longer operate (last day of service Saturday 31st January 2026). Following residents' concerns about the only bus service ending, Barrowby Parish Council has been raising this with Lincolnshire County Council (LCC) and bus providers to seek continuity of service for the village.

LCC has confirmed that from **Monday 2nd February 2026**, a replacement bus service will run through Barrowby into Grantham. This will be operated by Transport Connect Ltd, a Teckal company owned by LCC, and will run for the next 6 months while longer-term options are assessed. The service number **93B** will stop at the regular stops Monday - Friday every 2 hours

FOOD WASTE RECYCLING STARTS IN SOUTH KESTEVEN THIS APRIL

A new **weekly** food waste recycling service is launching across South Kesteven from **Monday 13 April 2026**, as part of a national initiative to improve recycling and reduce waste.

What you need to know

- Your bin collection day is not changing.
- Put your food waste caddy out on your normal collection day, alongside your usual bins.
- You can start using the caddies from **Monday 6 April 2026**, ahead of the first collection.

What you'll receive

In **February**, every household will receive:

- a small 5L kitchen caddy
- a larger 23L outdoor caddy
- an initial supply of liners
- instructions and your collection schedule

What can go in?

Food scraps like plate scrapings, peelings, tea bags, coffee grounds, and other food waste. Tie the liner and place it in the outdoor caddy for weekly collection.

What happens to the food waste?

It will be processed at an anaerobic digestion facility and turned into renewable energy and fertiliser, helping reduce landfill waste and supporting greener local services.

SPOTLIGHT ON BARROWBY MEMORIAL HALL

Barrowby Memorial Hall was proposed in 1945 as a Living Memorial mainly to the Second World War. During the time to March 1946 the land and building were bought by various fund raising efforts and public subscription. Many people gave their time and effort and even petrol coupons to get the building from Long Bennington and erected. It opened in March 1946 offering the Living Memorial with many activities including tennis courts. For what was then still a relatively small village it was very well used.

During the early years, up to about 1962, the Memorial Hall offered Old Time Dances, Whist Drives, hiring out for parties, (as it still does) and an Annual Flower and Vegetable Show. As time went by it was decided that the building needed a new roof and additional protection to the wooden structure, being now almost 60 years old. In order to fund this work the tennis courts were sold off for housing, the new roof put on and the brickwork 'skirt' added. The Hall has continued to provide a venue for many activities and meetings.

GARDENERS' ASSOCIATION: TIPS FOR FEBRUARY

On the veg plot:

- Sow early peas and broad beans in the vegetable plot.
- Sprout early potatoes—egg boxes work well for this purpose.
- Sow onion seeds in trays at the end of the month, ready for transplanting later.
- Plant shallots, if not already done in January.
- Sow lettuce under glass at the end of the month for an early crop.
- Sow radish under glass for an early crop.
- Cover rhubarb crowns with well-rotted manure.



In the garden:

- Check on gladioli corms.
- Check dahlia tubers—if they are shrivelling, plunge them in tepid water overnight
- Plant lilies if the weather is mild.
- Sow sweet peas.
- Continue aeration of lawns if weather is dry; scatter any worm casts.
